



SCHOOL DAY COMMUNICATION

For the 2025-26 school year, we use an app called **SCHOOL PASS.** Sending a note in SchoolPass automatically updates teachers & staff! New families will be sent login and download instructions over the summer. This must be used to communicate all absences, late arrivals, and early pickups.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

CARLINE

MORNING CARLINE: 8:15 - 8:30 AM AFTERNOON CARLINE: 3:30PM

Enter on Broadway Avenue South and follow Rice Street East to the parking lot. First person in carline can pull up to the basketball hoop. Students will be lined up on sidewalk and once carline moves through and stops, they will get into cars.

Students who live in the Wayzata School District can ride

the bus. Teachers ride buses with students the first week of school to help new riders. Reach out to WPS (763-745-5240) to have your child routed, and let the school know when confirmed.



Parents please enter the building on Rice Street through Door #6. After 8:30, bring students in who are late. Parents enter here if picking up early - sign out students in the school office.



CLUBHOUSE & EXTRACURRICULARS

Signups for Clubhouse and After School Activities will come out in early August. We try to accommodate all families interested. These are fee-based programs.


Extracurriculars include Band (during school day), Piano, Choir, Girls Volleyball and Boys & Girls Basketball.

VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENTS

In order to volunteer at St. Bart's, you need to be VIRTUS Certified. Being VIRTUS certified entails safety training, a code of conduct, and a background check. Renewals are required every 3 years. Please complete these requirements prior to the start of the school year so you can say "YES" to the many ways of volunteering at our school. Background checks can take 2 to 3 weeks. You cannot volunteer until background checks are returned.

DO YOU HAVE A LUNCH PROGRAM?

YES! We cater in a hot and cold lunch option daily from Premier Kitchen, Inc. About three weeks before the start of the month the school will send out a google form and menu to place your child's order. You can order as many or as few meals as you desire.

WHAT ABOUT UNIFORMS?

Uniforms can be purchased through Educational Outfitters in St. Louis Park, online or in-store through Land's End, or through our Used Uniform Market near the main entrance of the school. CLICK HERE for the uniform look book! Please note - dress shoes are OPTIONAL on Mass days.

WHAT DO I DO IF MY CHILD IS SICK?

New families - look for your account and login information for SchoolPass in August. All sick days, early pickups, late drop-offs, and schedule changes are made through your SchoolPass app. This will automatically alert all staff and teachers for you! Reach out to the office if you need help after set-up. If absences are extended, your teacher will work with you to provide any makeup work.

WHEN IS MASS?

Students attend Mass weekly on Wednesdays at 9:00 am, unless a Holy Day or other change is communicated ahead of time. Students must wear their <u>Mass Uniforms!</u> All parents, grandparents, and friends are invited to worship with us each week! Students, however, must always sit with their class and teachers. Preschoolers attend Mass on Holy Days.

HOW DO I FIND MORE ANSWERS?

Please take this opportunity to fully peruse this year's <u>Student Handbook</u>. Pay special attention to the attendance and uniform policies. If you have any additional questions, call the school office, your child's teacher, your mentor family, or Mrs. Vance.
